Course Description

With an emphasis on World Literature, English 10 prepares students to be college-and-career-ready in the areas of reading, writing, research, listening and speaking. More information can be found on Westlake's website, including a 10th grade curriculum map. Learning in this class is based heavily on **in-class** participation.

Materials Needed

- The following materials are required for this class:
- A novel of choice
- Blue- or black-ink pen, pencil, sharpener
- A 1-inch, 3-ring binder, exclusively for this class, 5 dividers and *loose-leaf paper*
- Colored pens or pencils
- Highlighters
- 3x5" note cards
- A thumb drive (optional but recommended)

Absences

When you are absent, check the class website <u>before returning</u> to class, and email me or come in before/after school with questions. Try to turn in your assignments the day you return; however, you will have until the class period after you return (at the <u>beginning</u> of class) to get full credit; after that, the work is considered late. Please write "ABSENT" at the top of your assignment. If you are absent the day an assignment is due, but you were present when it was assigned, the assignment is due upon return to class. Bell-ringer points must be made up the day you return, before or after school.

Tardies

To avoid being marked tardy, please *be in your seat when the tardy bell rings*. Those who are entering the room as the bell rings may be marked tardy if this is a recurring pattern. Students who are tardy lose 5 participation points. Sign the Tardy Log to avoid an unexcused absence. I will accept <u>one</u> excused tardy per term.

Bell-ringer quizzes will be given at the beginning of class. *If you are tardy, you forfeit bell-ringer points.*

Homework / Class Work

Homework is due the class period after it is assigned *at the beginning of class*, and class work is due when called for. Please keep all assignments, handouts, and graded papers in your English binder until the end of the term, and digitally save all work done on a computer.

Late Work

Late assignments will receive <u>half credit</u> and may be turned in up to the mid- or end-ofterm deadline. <u>No late assignments will be</u> <u>accepted the last week of a term</u>. Some assignments, such as presentations and peer reviews, cannot be turned in late.

Students who are failing the class may turn in work beyond the regular deadline $\underline{if}(1)$ they are working for credit only (D- grade) and (2) they have conferenced with the teacher to set up an academic contract.

Participation

Learning in this class is inextricably tied to participation. For this reason, students may lose participation points if they are absent, tardy, truant, have poor conduct, lack involvement in class activities, or have a cell phone in their lap or on their desk. These points cannot be made up.

Citizenship

Our classroom will be a safer, happier, more productive environment if we all follow three simple rules: (1) Be Positive, (2) Be Respectful, and (3) Be Engaged.

Be Positive

There is power in positivity. We all deserve to learn in an environment that is free from negativity, cynicism, or bitterness.

Be Respectful

Respect the rights of others. We all have a right to learn. No one has the right to take away a right from anyone else. When someone disrupts class, he/she takes away the right of others to learn.

We can show respect by following school and classroom rules, such as dress code, attendance, and participation. We can even show respect through our body language. Listen quietly when it's someone else's turn to talk. Respect property. Pick up and throw away trash.

Keep cell phones and other devices *turned off* and put away, not on your desk or in your lap, during class time.

Be Engaged

Come to class ready to participate fully in activities, assignments, and discussions. Put away assignments from other classes. Put away cell phones. Sleep at home instead of in the classroom.

Academic Requirements

70% = assignments and participation 30% = mastery assessments

There is *no re-doing assignments* for a better grade. However, mastery assessments *must be remediated* if a score falls below the mastery cutoff. Until then, a score of "0" will be entered

in Skyward. The goal of remediation is to master the concepts, not to change the grade.

Magic Passes

Each student is given three "Magic" passes per term, which may be used to go to your locker, to go to the bathroom, to get a drink, to borrow a book during silent reading, to get extra credit at the end of the term (if all assignments have been turned in), or to turn in *some* late assignments without penalty. <u>For late work,</u> <u>passes must be used within 2 weeks after the</u> <u>due date</u>.

Food and Drinks

Food and drinks (except bottled water) should not be brought into the classroom.

Cheating

Cheating in any form will result in an "F." *If* you are given the opportunity to make up the work, the maximum grade will be a D-. Examples of cheating and unethical behavior include

- plagiarizing (using another person's words or ideas, but failing to credit that person)
- copying another's work or allowing someone to copy your work
- cutting and pasting from the Internet without giving credit
- communicating with someone during a test/quiz
